

Web Accessibility Directive

- Important to make projects accessible to all
- Directive (EU) 2016/2102 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26
 October 2016 on the accessibility of the websites and mobile applications of public sector bodies

The text of the Directive:

- Covers websites and mobile apps of public sector bodies;
- Refers to the standards to make websites and mobile apps more accessible e.g. text for images, reverse contrast or that websites can be browsed without a mouse etc explained in the WCAG2.1 guidelines;
- Requires regular monitoring and reporting of public sector websites and mobile apps by Member States

EU Accessibility Act – To Be Passed By June 2025

- The European accessibility act covers products and services that have been identified as being most important for persons with disabilities while being most likely to have diverging accessibility requirements across EU countries
- Designed to create equal access for Europeans with disabilities by defining a single set of accessibility standards for all Member States
- The Commission consulted stakeholders and experts on accessibility and took into account the obligations deriving from the UNCRPD

Websites & Electronic Platforms

- Compliant with Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)
 - Offers a wide range of recommendations
- Malta Communications Authority and FITA can also be consulted
- Some examples include:
 - Maltese Sign Language on videos
 - Subtitles
 - Alternative Text for images
 - Colour Contrast

Publicity Campaigns/Awareness Raising/Research Reports etc

- Accessible to everyone
- Easy Language versions
 - Easier to understand and more accessible for those with reading difficulties
 - Uses common words, supporting visuals, and a clear structure and format
- Soft copies (online accessible)
- Maltese & English versions

Conferences/Training Sessions/Events


- Physically Accessible

- Support requirements should be sought at registration stages
 - Sign Language
 - Interpreters
 - Reserved Parking (Mobility)
- Quiet Rooms
- Accessible break areas seating
