## Eligibility Guidance Notes Call 9 for Project Proposals

Specific Objective 1.6: Contributing to the protection and restoration of aquatic biodiversity and ecosystems

Type of Actions:

1. Actions targeted at the collection of lost fishing gears and the passive collection of marine litter from the sea in line with the Single Use Plastic Products Strategy for Malta 2021-2030 and in line with the Prioritised Action Framework (PAF) for Natura 2000 in Malta (2021-2027).



### 1. Scope of the Eligibility Guidelines

The scope of these Eligibility Guidelines is to provide assistance to prospective Applicants when applying for projects part-financed by the European Maritime, Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund (EMFAF) Programme 2021-2027.

In Malta, the European Maritime, Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund Programme falls under the responsibility of the Managing Authority (MA), the Funds and Programmes Division (FPD), within the Ministry responsible for the Economy, European Funds and Lands (MEFL).

Potential Applicants are encouraged to read through these Eligibility Guidelines and the relevant sections of the <u>EMFAF Programme<sup>1</sup></u> as will be highlighted in the sections below, to avoid submitting ineligible applications.

Prospective Applicants are also encouraged to go through the Indicator Guidance Notes for better understanding of what is requested with regards to the indicators section.

## 2. Background information on the EMFAF 2021-2027 programming period

The EMFAF Programme provides the opportunity to Malta to support investment within its fisheries and aquaculture sectors. The EMFAF is expected to build upon the investments of previous programming period, thus aiming to maximise the added value of public investment. The below is a brief overview of the Programme:

The EU share is that of  $\leq 21,825,290$  which when adding the national counterpart will add up to  $\leq 31,178,987$ . The EMFAF is divided in between two priorities as explained below:

- 1. Priority 1: Fostering sustainable fisheries and the conservation of aquatic biological resources
- 2. Priority 2: Fostering sustainable aquaculture activities and processing, and marketing of fisheries and aquaculture products

Both priorities include within them different type of actions as outlined within the programme itself. All type of actions are linked to different specific objectives which ultimately contribute to the respective priority. Some actions which are planned under this programme include investments on-board fishing vessels, advisory services, training and diversification opportunities targeting support for professional fishers as well as improvement in designated fishing ports and landing infrastructure. Funding shall also help in enhanced data collection activities and investment in control and enforcement. Other actions included in the programme target the protection and restoration of aquatic biodiversity and ecosystems, together with research and innovation actions targeting the sustainability, resilience and competitiveness of the fisheries and aquaculture sectors. Additionally, awareness-raising campaigns shall focus on the promotion of sustainable fish consumption.

Both priorities mentioned above, include within them operations of strategic importance such as the conservation and restoration of marine Natura 2000 areas. Such measures and operations will seek an integrated approach towards management of relevant economic and environmental sectors, in collaboration with all relevant stakeholders.

Under the second priority, another operation of strategic importance will be the research and development on domestication of aquaculture species to promote species diversification. In line with Malta's Multiannual National Plan for the Development of Sustainable Aquaculture 2022-2030, which aims to improve the sustainability and competitiveness of the sector, support will be given to research, innovation and investment in the introduction of new-culture species to decrease reliance in the limited national number of species currently available.

In addition to the above, the programme will support the provision of training to address the needs of fishers and sector-related employees. Support will also be given to interventions related to advisory services with the aim of improving the overall performance and competitiveness of operators and to promote sustainable fisheries. Main initiatives will include the promotion of the Fisheries and Aquaculture sectors, modernisation through support for new technology equipment as well as a strong focus on data collection and control, addressing marine litter, climate change and biodiversity impacts.

## 3. Context of the Call

This call under the EMFAF is an open call to project proposals to be submitted by:

- Public authorities/entities
- Local Councils;
- Fishers including small-coastal fishers, fishing cooperatives and associations;
- Non-Government Organisations (NGO's) involved in marine/fisheries/nature protection;
- Entities and research institutions involved with research/ studies/ assessments in the marine environment and similar.

The Applicant is to ensure that the proposal fits within the below Specific Objective and type of action:

Specific Objective 1.6 – Contributing to the protection and restoration of aquatic biodiversity and ecosystems.

Type of Actions:

1. Actions targeted at the collection of lost fishing gears and the passive collection of marine litter from the sea in line with the Single Use Plastic Products Strategy for Malta 2021-2030 and in line with the Prioritised Action Framework (PAF) for Natura 2000 in Malta (2021-2027).

Only proposals which can demonstrate their contribution to the above Specific objective are eligible to apply.

At project evaluation stage, the Project Selection Committee shall consult the State Aid Monitoring Board to obtain clearance regarding the involvement of state aid.

## 2. The Application Process

Applications should be submitted electronically on the Structural Funds Database available at sfd.gov.mt/application by not later than  $27^{th}$  June 2025 noon.

Submission of an Application Form is considered as a formal statement by the applicant organisation that all the details in the application form are factually correct. It is also a confirmation that should the project be approved, the Applicant will carry out the project as described in the application form, including any amendments that maybe proposed by the Project Selection Committee during evaluation or by Managing Authority, in line with the conditions stipulated in the Grant Agreement, and the applicable procedures, rules and regulations applicable to the fund concerned.

## 3. Project Eligibility and Selection Criteria

Projects submitted will be evaluated by the Project Selection Committee according to the eligibility and selection criteria (refer to table below) which have been approved by the Monitoring Committee in line with Article 40 of the Common Provision Regulation (EU) 1060/2021. These criteria aim at ensuring that the projects are being selected within the Specific Objective parameters and can concretely contribute to the achievements of the objectives and results of the Programme. For a project to be considered for funding or to be placed on the reserve list, a project must pass all the Eligibility Criteria and must also obtain a minimum of 50% of the total marks allocated to the Selection Criteria. However, the project must achieve the threshold for each of the relevant selection criteria (*where applicable*) in order to be considered further, even if the total points achieved exceed 50%.

Moreover, the assessment will take into consideration the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union when applying criteria and procedures, as well as accessibility to persons with disabilities as per Articles 23 and 26 of the respective Charter, ensure gender equality as per Article 23, and take account of the principle of sustainable development and of the Union policy on the environment in accordance with Article 11 and Article 191(1) TFEU.

Table 1 below indicates the approved eligibility and selection criteria.

Eligibility criteria are the essential criteria that all projects must meet to be admissible for a further qualitative assessment. Such eligibility criteria are normally assessed through a technical assessment which ensures that all applications have reached a minimum standard. Projects which do not comply with the gateway eligibility criteria will not proceed to full appraisal and scoring.

Selection criteria are designed to assess the fit and contribution of project proposals with the Programme strategy, its target groups and its objectives. These criteria are divided in a way to capture both quantitative assessment and qualitative assessment. The evaluation will combine both data (quantitative and qualitative) to have a comprehensive understanding of the proposal.

Eligibility Criteria Eligibility criteria are the essential criteria that all projects must meet in order to be admissible for a further qualitative assessment. Projects which do not comply with the gateway eligibility criteria will NOT proceed to full appraisal and scoring. Note: no numerical markings are involved in this section. ## 4. Evaluation and Assessment

Further to the eligibility and selection criteria as listed above, the assessment and selection of projects shall be undertaken by a Project Selection Committee. This call is envisaged to be a restricted call, issued to the Environment and Resources Authority, within the Ministry for Environment, Energy and Enterprise.

Applications will be assessed against the Eligibility and Selection Criteria by the Project Selection Committee and will proceed to be assessed against the Selection Criteria only if the application meets all the requirements of the Eligibility Criteria.

A project must achieve 50% of the marks to be considered for funding. However, the project must achieve the threshold for each of the relevant criteria in order to be considered further, even if the total points achieved exceed 50%.

The voting members shall decide how the project proposal addresses each of the below criteria and assign marking points according to the following guide:

- Excellent 81 to 100% of points
- Very good 76 to 80% of points
- Satisfactory 50 to 75% of points
- Very poor 26 to 49% of points
- Unacceptable 1 to 25% of points.
