Important Information on Green Travel & Expensive Travel Cost Eligibility

Dear Erasmus+ Beneficiaries,

We would like to provide you with important information regarding the eligibility and reimbursement process for Green Travel and Expensive Travel Costs under the Erasmus+ programme. These options are designed to promote environmentally sustainable travel and to support participants facing high travel costs due to specific constraints.

1. Green Travel Eligibility

Green travel refers to the use of environmentally friendly transport modes such as trains, buses, carpooling, and other low-emission means instead of air travel. The main part of the overall journey must be undertaken by sustainable means, meaning that more than 50% of the travel distance must be covered using these options.

Beneficiaries opting for green travel may receive:

- Additional individual support for up to six extra travel days (if needed due to longer journey times).
- **Higher travel grants** compared to standard travel.

To claim green travel support, beneficiaries must provide evidence of their journey, such as train or bus tickets. In the case of carpooling, a declaration signed by all travellers is required.

For example, a participant travelling from **Malta to Germany**, taking a ferry or flight for the first part of the journey (To Sicily) and then continuing by train instead of flying the entire way, would qualify for green travel.

Important: To qualify as green travel, more than 50% of the journey, including the return trip, must be completed using sustainable modes of transportation.

They could receive up to six extra travel days and higher travel grants to accommodate the longer duration.

Travel Grant Rates for Call Years 2024 & 2025:

2. Expensive Travel Costs Eligibility

Participants may be eligible for expensive travel cost reimbursement if their standard travel grant does not cover at least 70% of actual travel costs due to:

- **Remote locations** with limited transport connections.
- **High travel costs** resulting from economic conditions.
- The necessity of specific travel routes due to accessibility needs.

If granted, the exceptional costs for expensive travel will replace the standard travel support based on unit costs, covering 80% of the actual travel expenses incurred.

To apply, beneficiaries must submit:

- A cost comparison and justification for selecting expensive travel options.
- Receipts and supporting documents showing actual travel costs.

For instance, a participant travelling from a remote Maltese island to Finland might face significantly higher travel costs due to multiple transport modes (ferry, train, flights). In such cases, they may qualify for expensive travel cost reimbursement.

3. Travel Grant and Funded Travel Days

Under the Travel Grant section in the mobility activity details, beneficiaries must indicate the Funded Travel Days where available:

- Up to 2 travel days if using non-sustainable means of transport.
- Up to 6 travel days if using sustainable means of transport.

The Travel Grant or Travel Support amount is calculated automatically, based on:

- The selected activity type.
- The distance band.
- The main means of transport (chosen from a dropdown list, distinguishing between sustainable and non-sustainable modes).

When a sustainable means of transport is selected, the Green Travel flag is automatically applied, increasing the funded travel duration available for claim from 2 to 6 days.

NB: All projects are subject to checks and audits therefore, beneficiaries must ensure that supporting documents are retained to substantiate their claims if required.

4. Eligible Key Actions

These travel cost options are available under the following Erasmus+ Key Actions:

KA1 - Learning Mobility of Individuals, including: Students (Higher Education, Vocational Education and Training)

Staff (Higher Education, Vocational Education and Training, Adult Education, and School Education)

Youth Exchanges

Mobility projects for sport staff


