KEY DATA ON THE PROJECT:

Objective: modernAKIS aims to improve key AKIS actors' capacities to leverage individual, organizational and systemic resources needed to accelerate the transformation towards more coherent, effective and efficient AKIS systems and the transition to a more sustainable management and use of natural resources in farming and forestry.

Duration: 7 years, 01.09.2022 – 31.08.2029

Budget: approx. €10 Mio.

Partner organisations: 37 partners form all 27 EU Member States (see map)



Given the novelty and complexity of designing, implementing and monitoring the AKIS, the European Commission (EC) launched a project call to **support the AKIS CBs and AKIS communities in the Member States in improving the AKIS**. This led to the proposal of the **modernAKIS project** - Modernisation of Agriculture through more efficient and effective agricultural Knowledge and Innovation Systems.

What is an Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation System (AKIS)?



The main players: farmers/foresters, advisors, researchers, organizations, NGOs, networks, retailers, media, services, various ministries...:

Defined as the **organizations, systems and people**, including the that are active in the creation, dissemination and use of knowledge and information, with the aim of supporting decision-making, problem-solving and innovation in agriculture

Background:

- **European Union (EU) visionary goals** (e.g. European Green Deal) to tackle climate change, sustainability etc.
- Timely access and ability to integrate rapidly evolving scientific knowledge, innovation and technological developments across all actors who participate in agricultural value chains is key to a successful transition towards the European vision
- 2021-2027 Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) stipulates the importance of effective Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation Systems (AKISs) in this regard.



Project objectives

- Build a European network of AKIS actors from all EU MS
- Build capacities of AKIS coordination bodies (AKIS CBs) to improve the organization and functioning of their AKIS
- Build capacities of key AKIS actors and coach them to set-up and sustain local/regional/national AKIS Communities of Practice in all MS
- Provide a knowledge exchange platform, tools and methods supporting knowledge flows
- Collect and exchange practice-oriented knowledge on how advisors and innovation support can be integrated into the AKIS
- Development of cross-border approaches to initiate and incentivize innovation

AKIS Coordinating Body (...based on Malta's CAP SP)

- The current knowledge transfer and advisory set-up in Malta requires better consolidation.
- The CAP SP will aim to ensure a more coordinated approach to knowledge transfer, innovation and digitalisation in Malta among key actors such as the Malta College for Arts, Science and Technology (MCAST), Malta Council for Science and Technology (MCST), University of Malta, Agriculture Directorate, other private advisors who assist in the drafting of applications, and entities responsible for setting up training courses aimed at supporting arable land farmers and livestock breeders
- ✓ The AKIS Coordination Body will facilitate the implementation of the CAP SP deliverables linked to:
 - Education and all types of training experiences;
 - Improving the relevance and uptake of research & innovation by potential CAP beneficiaries;
 - Knowledge Transfer and Farm Advisory Services;
 - Improved networking, collaboration and development of innovation support services to strengthen links between research, registered advisors, the farming community, and cooperation & interactive-innovation projects, including the Digital Transition in Agriculture.

<u>1. Country-based</u> (national) CoPs: set up at country/regional level

 multi-actor interaction and dialogue, support to AKIS CB, trust building among the local key actors of change

(min. 1 CoP/MS)

- ✓ will support AKIS CB's job to implement AKIS
- ✓ Existing AKIS groups → modernAKIS cbCoPs if they meet principles and perform similar functions
- ✓ 3600 euro / national CoP catering, venue, travel & accommodation
- National CoP meetings should be organized 2-3 times per year (at least 1x/year as a physical meeting). Each organizer has a budget of 600 euro/year for national CoP meetings. This budget can be used for venue, catering and travel.

- ✓ focus on the learning between countries, organised around topical areas pertinent to the CAP Strategic Plans of the MS
- ✓ The ccCoPs are participatory groups composed of actors from each Member State with the aim of exchanging knowledge, generating capacities, and sharing good practices within the thematic framework of their interest.
- ✓ From each national CoP, one member (maximum two) will be identified internally to participate annually in the meetings established for the ccCoP that they join
- ✓ Each ccCoP will have 1 or 2 meeting per year
- ✓ There are 5 ccCoPs with 5 different thematic frameworks....
