
Actions carried out to commit the Operational Programme by end 2019



- Conclusion of evaluation of Call VIII: 3 projects under PA 8 approved for a total public eligible value of €12.9M, resulting in commitment of all PAs, with the exception of PA 4.
- Consultation sessions with local stakeholders by EIF in preparation for the launch of the Call for the Financial Intermediaries for the Financial Instrument for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency measures.





Implementation Progress – PA1



Two mainstream projects with a total public eligible value of €52M currently being implemented.

Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

Sustainable Living Complex (SLC)

- Following excavation works on site, the design of the tender for civil works of the SLC was nearing completion, with infrastructural works expected to commence in 2020.
- ➤ Lab equipment has been acquired, which will enable research on resource-efficient buildings.

Implementation Progress – PA1

EU funds | 2014 for Malta | 2020

Transdisciplinary Research and Knowledge Exchange Complex (TRAKE)

- Finishing works on Metallurgy and Materials Engineering Laboratories (MMEL) nearing completion; excavation works at the main building has also been fully completed, together with the design of the building.
- Delivery of lab equipment made it possible for the UoM to start undergoing research activities in the areas of bioengineering, robotics, manufacturing, and transport.
- > By end 2019, c. 50 FTE of researchers were undertaking research with such equipment.

Aid Scheme Progress – PA1



The Aid Scheme under PA 1 (**Business Enhance – RD&I Grant Scheme**) is divided into 4 measures:

- Measure 1: Feasibility Studies
- Measure 2: Research and Development Projects
- Measure 3: Investment in Research Infrastructure
- Measure 4: Process Innovation

The scheme is being implemented through open rolling calls and in 2019 although there were 6 cut off dates, only 1 application was submitted and approved for funding of €0.4M under Measure 2.

In 2020, there were 3 cut off dates, however no applications were submitted.

Failure to satisfy the eligibility criteria and the low number of applications received is making it challenging to reach the €20M commitment of this grant scheme.



Aid Scheme Progress – PA1

Measures taken during 2019 to promote the Aid Scheme

- Following consultations with the Malta Council for Science and Technology (MCST) to identify enterprises active in research, the IB communicated directly in writing with such enterprises to inform them about the possibility for support;
- Several one-to-one meetings were also held with other enterprises to provide details of their potential participation under this Grant Scheme;
- Adverts specifically addressing the Business Enhance RD&I Grant Scheme were published in the Business Agenda (June issue) and the Malta CEOs 2020 issue;
- Other publicity measures covering all Business Enhance ERDF Grant Schemes were undertaken by the IB, including information sessions each month for the business community, meetings with enterprises on a weekly basis from Business 1st, and active participation during the 2019 SME Week




Status update as at April 2020

- Progress in procurement with the publication of the mechanical and electrical works, as well as the finishes and fixtures for the substructure and superstructure of the SLC open on the market till June 2020, together with the publication of more tenders for lab equipment for both SLC and TRAKE;
- Progress in evaluation of the tender related to the mechanical and electrical installations and finishing works of TRAKE's main building, expected to be awarded by June 2020;
- Finishing works on the Materials Engineering Laboratories under TRAKE nearing completion whilst works on the main building progressed with the building of the reservoirs. As regards SLC, although excavation works are stalled until procurement issues are settled, the design and built contractor has completed the execution of the piles and is currently carrying out surveys of the site.





Implementation Progress – PA 2



Two mainstream projects with a public eligible value of €33.5M currently being implemented.

Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

- Successful closure of SIntegraM, directly resulting in the development of a single platform for data gathering and storing that allows multiple Government Ministries and entities to access the same data.
- One of the key deliverables is a new base map for the Maltese Islands. Produced from high-resolution orthographic imagery with an impeccable precision and ability to collect detailed information, the new base map reflects the realities of today. It is widely used for environmental analysis, development planning, laying of new roads, ambulance detours, bus routes and other location-based policy making.

Implementation Progress – PA 2

Under **CoNvErGE**, aiming at setting up e-Service applications beneficial to business and citizens, an additional 10 new e-services and e-platforms have been successfully set up in 2019.


These include several related to the health sector, such as:

- Electronic Patient Records (EPR) for Primary Health Care;
- Patient Consent Management System;
- Health Data Exchange System;
- Patient Registry for the Directorate for Health Information and Research (DHIR);
- IT solution for the Department of Pharmaceutical Affairs.

Aid Scheme Progress – PA 2



The **Aid Scheme (E-Commerce Grant Scheme)** is being implemented through open rolling calls with different cut off dates.

During 2019, there were 6 cut off dates:

- > 31 applications were submitted, out of which 1 is still pending evaluation;
- 9 grants were approved with a total value of €39k;
- > The benefitting enterprises were 7 micro and 2 small companies.

By end 2019, the benefitting companies amounted to 54.

During 2020 there were 3 cut off dates.


9 applications were submitted out of which 7 are still pending evaluation; and

To date, the benefitting companies amount to 54 (because of withdrawals) for a total assistance of €248k.



Status update as at April 2020

- In 2020, CONVERGE has launched another component: the European Legislation Identifier (ELI), which provides easy and flexible online access to the Laws of Malta, and promotes interoperability between legal systems on an European level;
- A new contract for the supply of equipment at the Lands Registry has been signed, which will further assist in the creation of a number of eService applications in the areas of Government to Business (G2B), Government to Citizen (G2C) and Government to Government (G2G).







Implementation Progress – PA 3



Three mainstream projects and five Aid Schemes with a public eligible value of €44.6M are being implemented under this PA.

Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

The Xewkija Enterprise Hub in Gozo officially inaugurated in November and the first lease agreement signed in December;

An additional 9 lease agreements were also signed for the Industrial Workshop Complex also in Xewkija;





- Following the conclusion of embellishment works within the Crafts Village at Ta' Qali, 14 tenants have continued investing in rehabilitation works on their individual units. Road works on site have now been completed with lighting poles and LED lighting;
- Up till 2019, 242 unique enterprises benefitted from the Internationalization Knowledge Platform in several manners, including using research material available on the platform, applying to participate in expos and seminars abroad and the production of promotional videos by 20 enterprises;

Aid Scheme Progress – PA 3



Five Aid Schemes aiming to assist undertakings in growth, start-up investment, diversification and innovation, internationalisation and consultancy.

The schemes are being implemented through open rolling calls with different cut off dates.

During 2019, each scheme had 7 cut off dates with the exception of the consultancy and the internationalisation scheme which had 12 cut off dates:

- 166 applications were submitted, out of which 30 were still pending evaluation;
- > 92 operations were approved with a total value of €4.8M;
- > The benefitting enterprises were made up of 53 micro, 36 small and 3 medium companies.

By end 2019, the benefitting companies amounted to 251.


In 2020 there were 3 cut off dates for each scheme.

- > 21 grants were approved with a total value of €1.5M;
- The benefitting enterprises were 19 micro and 2 small companies.

To date, the benefitting companies amount to 263 for a total assistance of €16.9M.








Status update as at April 2020

- At the Crafts Village in Ta' Qali, works by the tenants on individual units are ongoing. Construction works for Incubation Centre & Interpretation Centre, complimenting the actions financed under the project, are expected to start in the coming weeks;
- External works ongoing at the Industrial Workshop Complex in Xewkija;
- Promotional campaign on the Internationalisation Knowledge Platform has been undertaken, with particular emphasis on online marketing and the information tools developed through the project.







Three mainstream projects related to Energy Efficiency with a total public eligible value of €6.6M are being implemented.

The projects mainly deal with reaching Malta's EU 2020 objective in relation to energy.

Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

Main tender for an energy efficient lighting system together with a heating, ventilation and air-conditioning (HVAC) system that will result in a carbon efficient residence minimising energy demand for the St. Vincent De Paul Residence (retirement home) awarded in Q4 2019. Works related to the HVAC system are ongoing;

Final implementation stages of the project to increase energy efficiency in Malta's arterial and distributor roads street lighting through the installation of over 3,000 smart LED **street lighting**, covering Malta's main arterial and distributor roads. A decrease of c. 70% of annual primary energy consumption is expected under this project;

Upgrading and retrofitting of the Administration Centre of the Ministry for Gozo aimed to minimise the building's energy consumption. As at end of 2019, some energy efficient measures were implemented. The project is expected to continue implementing under actions forseen in 2020.

Five mainstream projects related to Renewable Energy with a total public eligible value of €15.7M were being implemented, one of which was concluded in 2018.

Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

- The Domestic Grant Scheme continued to prove to be very successful with 6,085 households benefitting from financial support to undertake investment in Renewable Energy Systems by installing PV panels. The PVs installed have produced 20.8MW of additional capacity of renewable energy production;
- NGO-led projects registered progress with conclusion of procurement processes and installation of PVs.

Financial Instrument – PA 4



- Following the signature of the Funding Agreement for a new Financial Instrument to provide better access to finance for both households and enterprises through the provision of a capped guarantee for loans related to Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy measures with EIF, 2 meetings of the Investment Board were held in 2019;
- Decisions on the call for Expression of Interest and the advisory package were taken;
- > The Call for Expression of Interest was launched in January 2020 and is expected to be on the market till Q2 2020.




Status update as at April 2020

- Works on two wards at St. Vincent de Paul Residence are at a very advanced stage;
- Roofing works at the Administration Centre at the Ministry for Gozo have been completed and most of the double glazed apertures were installed; the reinstallation of PV system is expected to start in Q2 2020;
- > The **streetlighting** project was completed with the installation of the last few remaining controllers;
- The Church School Association's main tender for the supply, installation and commissioning of photovoltaic schools in St. Monica Schools of Fleur-de-Lys and Mosta has been awarded and is expected to be completed in Q3 2020.





Twenty-eight cultural and natural heritage projects with a public eligible value of €74M are being implemented under this PA.

Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

- Ongoing restoration works on both soffits and walls of the Piano Nobile at the Grandmasters' Palace;
- Restoration works on the external façade of the Notarial Archives and its adjacent building; disinfestation of the entire collection of manuscripts;
- Restoration works of the tank rooms within the Mediterranean Conference Centre and the development of an augmented reality app;

- The footprint of the St. John's Co-Cathedral in Valletta has been expanded through the renovation and upgrading of the Caravaggio Centre, which will give visitors the opportunity to learn on the life and works of this artist, through user-friendly visual aids and interactive features;
- A rehabilitated area of 11,000sq.m. at the Chadwick Lakes through construction and maintenance of rubble walls and bridges and cleaning of valley bed;
- Restoration and reconstruction of several historical landmarks such as the Culture Windmill in Naxxar, the Xewkija Windmill in Gozo and the Clock Tower in Mtarfa, which will see these sites transformed into interpretation and cultural centres;
- Restoration on the Red Tower in Mellieha and the Santa Marija Tower in Comino are in an advanced stage of implementation;
- Completion of restoration works at the Attard railway embankment;

The Maltese and Gozitan Curias have joined forces to implement two projects involving restoration of churches and religious artefacts to promote the historical and religious traditions of the Maltese islands;

The Augustinian Priory in Valletta is also going under intensive restoration with works on the Church facade and side elevation nearing completion; Excavation works carried out so far revealed many hidden archaeology findings;



Status update as at April 2020

- Some of the main procurement procedures in several projects, such as the works contract for the MICAS Galleries and the Anglican Church in Valletta were concluded;
- Restoration works were ongoing with those of the Sacra Infermeria at the Mediterranean Conference Centre nearing completion with the focus now being on the augmented reality app;
- > The NGO-led projects have also registered progress with conclusion of procurement procedures and award of contracts. Most advanced in implementation are those led by the Malta and Gozo Curias with more than half of the activities completed.









Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

- Under 'Action A Improving the urban environment, the revitalisation of cities and the preservation of cultural heritage', the restoration of various historical sites at Lower Valletta has revamped a number of cultural assets found in the area, such as: the Auberge de Baviere, the House of Catalunya, fortifications, a number of churches and various religious shrines;
- Such interventions will stimulate the economic activity within this area and contribute to further develop the Maltese tourism experience;
- Provision of grants to private individuals to restore house facades and balconies in a traditional manner also contributes towards the improvement of the urban environment in Lower Valletta;

- Under 'Action B Social housing and community needs', rehabilitation works on housing blocks which were stripped completely and structurally reinforced, to accommodate finishes of modern standards, together with installation of lifts for better accessibility;
- Under 'Action C Enhancing the competitiveness of small and medium-sized enterprises', restoration works of the old abattoir have been completed. Ongoing mechanical and electrical installations and finishes for the new 'Valletta Design Cluster' will finally result in the provision of spaces and support facilities for cultural and creative practitioners.



Status update as at April 2020



- During the first months of 2020, implementation at the lower Valletta continued at a good pace;
- ➤ Works on 8 housing units at 34, Old Mint Street, a building that goes back around 400 years and a further 20 units at 90, West Street, were at an advanced stage of implementation;
- ➤ Historical features within the Lower Valletta area will feature on the heritage trail mobile app which is also at an advanced stage of implementation;
- Works on the Valletta Design Cluster have entered their final phase with works and installations related to the finishes of the building. All services have been installed. It is expected to be open to the public by end of year.







Allocation for Priority Axis 7 - €35.5M

One mainstream project **(SMITHS)** is being implemented with the aim of:

- encouraging a modal shift, sustainable & alternative low-carbon transport modes;
- facilitating alternative transport through new/improved maritime infrastructure;
- improve air quality and reduce GHG emissions from the transport sector.

By end 2019, progress was achieved with respect to:

- promotion of alternative clean and sustainable modes of commute; works related to the construction of segregated cycling lanes and pedestrian paths covering c. 2.75km were completed in 2019 and opened to the public;
- new multimodal hub in Gozo, the contract for the purchase of 6 fully electric powered buses was signed, to complement the new Park and Ride facility being constructed; delivery of vehicles is expected in 2020;
- civil works on the Sliema and Bormla ferry landing places have started but some delays were encountered both from the contractors' end as well as due to site conditions; mitigating measures against such delays were put in place.





Status update as at April 2020

- > The works at the Sliema and Bormla ferry landing sites have now accelerated with 70% of the foundation columns and piles now in place. In addition, revetment works in Sliema are also progressing, with 30% of the works completed;
- Discussions are being held with the relevant stakeholders to commence works on the design of the Marsamxett ferry landing site;
- Drafting of tenders in relation to the ITS platform and the marketing campaign has continued in 2020 with a planned publication date of Q2 2020.







Projects Under PA 8





Three new projects with a total public eligible amount of €12.9M have been approved in 2019:

- ➤ The setting up of the **Establishment for Blood, Tissue and Cell Centre** to provide for the stem cell, bone, cornea and amnion banking;
- Improvement of palliative care by Hospice Malta through the expansion of the Day Therapy Unit, Outpatients' Clinics and storage facility for equipment which can be loaned to patients;
- ➤ The setting up of a **Caritas Community Centre** to centralise in one place (i) all out-patient based services (non-residential) and (ii) all the administrative operations of the organisation.



Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

- In the area of social housing, **51 families benefitted** from **improved accessibility** with installations of energy efficient lifts. Whilst increasing safety of residents, this also provides easier access to disadvantaged people;
- Following the conclusion of the traffic impact studies, geotechnical investigations, land surveying and land contamination studies at the **Paola Health Regional Hub**, excavation works have progressed and were nearing completion, whilst the building designs were being finalised;
- The NGO-led project for the development of the Caritas Community Centre progressed significantly with demolition and excavation works completed and the commencement of construction works.




Social Housing - Installation of energy efficient lifts



Status update as at April 2020

- Since January 2020, in the area of **social housing**, order to start works for 66 blocks was issued through which works commenced in 47 blocks. As a result, 97 energy-efficient lifts were installed, and 11 blocks can be considered as finished completely;
- Progress registered in procurement processes with the evaluation of the Design and Build tender for the **Blood Bank** currently ongoing;
- New additional tenders for medical and IT equipment for the **Paola Primary**Health Care Southern Regional Hub have been drafted and are currently at vetting stage by the Department of Contracts. Tenders are expected to be published in the coming weeks.





Two mainstream projects with a total public eligible value of €33.9M are currently being implemented.

By means of these projects, Malta continued to work towards the EU 2020 objective in relation to Education, i.e. to reduce early school leavers rate to 10% and increase tertiary level education attainment to 33%.

The projects also promote increased links between education and industry, which has been a well-established practice in providing high quality training and streamlining education to make it as relevant to the industry as possible; thereby reducing skills mismatches.



Major achievements by end of 2019 include:

- Under INVEST, 71 VET labs have been fully completed and started hosting students during the 2019-2020 scholastic year;
- This is part of an initiative that sees the educational sector move from a 'one size fits all' system to a more inclusive and comprehensive learning system which supports all children's talents and needs through quality academic, vocational and applied learning programmes;
- A total of 2,508 students in state schools are studying at least one vocational or applied subject during the 2019-2020 scholastic year.

As part of the **MCAST Campus Master Plan** (Phase II):

- Faculty started hosting students and is currently delivering courses to **c. 450 students** from Level 1 to 7 in several subject areas such as welding, marine engineering, construction, HVAC, electrical installation, and woodwork to c. 450 students;
- Construction works on the new Institute of Information, Communication and Technology (IICT) and on the Resource Centre are ongoing;
- ▶ A College Management Information System has been set up to provide a data management framework, currently being used for online enrolment applications; immediate access to services and information by the students; real time data of students' academic performance; and monitoring of students' performance.




Status update as at April 2020












Projects Under PA 10





Seven mainstream projects including a Major Project with a total public eligible value of €190M are being implemented under this PA.

In the **waste sector**, progress registered in 2019:

- As part of the actions for the rehabilitation of the former landfill at **Wied Fulija**, re-profiling works of the waste mounds have been carried out and layering of granular material could start. Excavation works were also carried out for the construction of the reservoir;
- To kick-start the project for the setting up of a Multi-Material Recovery Facility within the grounds of the Civic Amenity site in Ħal Far, excavation works commenced;

Two information campaigns in the areas of waste and water are being carried out:

The **waste campaign** continued with several actions amongst which 2 new measures launched in October:

- The separation of waste as source through 5 kerbside collection vehicles
- The targeting of hazardous waste with the participation of 90% of all licenced pharmacies in Malta.

The water campaign, launched in September, included:

- 32 press articles and airing of 10 TV episodes
- Radio adverts and social media marketing
- Information stand at different public events

The interventions related to **Water**, have the objective of:

- Upgrading the water distribution network to improve water production, improve water production, wastewater collection and treatment and water reuse in the Maltese Islands (Major Project);
- Retrofitting of the Sant Antnin Wastewater Treatment Plant with innovative activated sludge-based technologies;
- Increasing knowledge on the occurrence of natural water resources in the Maltese islands; (Water Campaign and Monitoring Project)
- Setting up a Rainwater Integrated Infrastructure Network for rainwater management in five catchments in Malta.



By end of 2019, progress was registered on different actions of the **Water Major Project**:

- Completion of 3.4km Pembroke Ibragg tunnel section, part of underground tunnel from Pembrok RO to Malta's main reservoirs in Ta' Qali;
- Progress registered on civil works on the Gozo RO;
- Completion of EE measures at Pembroke and Cirkewwa RO through the retrofitting of 5 trains, each with a production capacity of 4,500 m3/day, with new pumping and energy recovery equipment.



Status update as at April 2020

- > The water campaign is ongoing; some of the activities, such as distribution of water saving kits, had to be postponed due to the current COVID situation;
- > Tender for the Excavation of Basins and the Construction of Water Retention at Wied il-Ghasel under the **RainWiin** project was recently awarded, with works envisaged to start in June 2020;
- Remodelling works at Wied Fulija continued to progress well with the works expected to be completed in 2020;
- > As regards the **Major Project**, progress continued to be made with regards to trenching and pipe laying for sewage and new water.







Implementation Progress – PA 11



3 projects with a **total public eligible value of €95.4M** are being funded under this PA, with the aim of:

- The upgrading of the existing roundabout junction at Node EA15 (Kappara) to a grade separated junction (project completed);
- The construction of a multilevel junction at Nodes EA20A & EA 21 (Marsa) and upgrading of other sections of the TEN-T Core and Comprehensive Network for the removal of existing traffic bottlenecks;
- The enhancement of the capacity of the Core TEN-T Port of Valletta by undertaking investment towards the setting up of a new cargo facility.

Implementation Progress – PA 11

EU funds | 2014 for Malta | 2020

By end of 2019:

TEN-T Roads:

- The widening works of the Marsa-Hamrun By-Pass was completed contributing towards an additional 1.1km of reconstructed and upgraded roads;
- Works on the Santa Lucija Underpass commenced in the latter half of 2019. The completion of this vehicular underpass is expected to result in 1.25km of enhanced TEN-T road section, with increased road safety and reductions in journey time.

TEN-T Ports:

Changes in location for the port project slowed down the drafting of tenders and the planning permit process. Studies prior to the commencement of works continued in 2019.





The MA ensures that projects being implemented under the Programme target the following areas:

- > Equality between men and women and non-discrimination;

To do so, the MA strives to ensure that the infrastructure is physically accessible to all, free of discriminatory stereotypes and that Beneficiaries provide information that is socially inclusive.

Moreover, the investments funded through EU funds respect the principles of non-discrimination on all grounds. This assessment is done at project's design stage, during implementation, as well as during its promotion and postimplementation activities.

Sustainable Development



Projects submitted for approval need to include Sustainable Development measures in line with the *Sustainable Development Strategy for the Maltese Islands 2007-2016* and the *Sustainable Development Act*, including:

- Contribution towards economic growth: through for instance increased efficiency in use of the water resources which will lead to a lower operational costs to households and economic sectors (Major Project), projects targeting development of improved transport infrastructure which will attract substantial investment (TEN-T ports and roads), education and training facilities through investment in human capital (INVEST and MCAST projects);
- Social cohesion: projects are encouraged to include measures aimed to reduce poverty and social exclusion: better social housing facilities through the installation of lifts and embellishment of common areas which ensures increased safety for the residents and facilitate anti-age discriminatory practices within housing estates and provide easier access to disadvantaged people (Regeneration of Social Housing), more effective and efficient online public services (CONVERGE);


Sustainable Development



- Protection of the environment: project proponents are encouraged to apply good practices in the use and sustainable management of natural resources: projects investing in the reduction of energy usage of street lighting systems through the installation of LED luminaires (Street lighting project), and storm water management through the reduction of flooding (Rainwiin);
- Impact on carbon neutrality: upgrading of infrastructure that takes into consideration climate change effects (Gozo Administration project), Building Management Systems to monitor and control HVAC systems (St Vincent de Paul), and reduction in CO2 emissions by encouraging a shift away from the high dependability on combustion engine vehicles to collective public transport thus aiming for a modal shift (SMITHS).






JASPERS Assistance



- > JASPERS is a technical assistance partnership between the European Commission, EIB and the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development.
- It provides independent advice to Member States to help prepare high quality major projects and projects of national importance to be co-financed by the European Regional Development Fund and the Cohesion Fund.
- JASPERS has been involved in Malta all throughout the 2014-2020 programming period, by providing assistance in the review of Cost-Benefit Analyses, Water and Waste projects, Transport, Research and Innovation and Sustainable Urban Development.
- In 2019, JASPERS were mainly involved in providing assistance for the revision of CBAs for the PA 1 projects.



Monitoring and Evaluation (2014-2020)









Monitoring of projects/schemes



- Day-to-day monitoring of project implementation on the basis of commitments undertaken in the Preliminary Agreements and Grant Agreements signed between the MA and the Beneficiaries.
- MPSC meetings between the MA, Line Ministries and the Beneficiaries with the participation of relevant stakeholders to address issues related to procurement and progress in the implementation.
- Use of Structural Funds Database (SFD14-20) to monitor projects on an ongoing basis.
- MA checks on the procurement and on-the-spot checks to verify progress of the implementation of the approved projects. During 2019, there were 156 procurement, employment and general checks and 13 physical checks on mainstream projects.
- Regular communication with the Measures Support Division to monitor progress on Aid Schemes. In 2019, 43 checks were carried out by the Managing Authority.

Monitoring of indicators



- Verification of Performance Framework milestones:
 - In order to monitor progress and ensure that targets are met, the MA carried out a thorough verification exercise of the Performance Framework milestones for 2018;
 - These monitoring checks are replicated on a bi-annual basis, with the MA focusing on checking that data collected is in line with definitions, ensuring that relevant supporting documentation is available; tracing and verifying data aggregation being reported by the IBs and BNs to the MA; and carrying out physical on the spot checks to verify achievement.
- Ongoing verification of Indicators
 - During 202,0 a Standard Operating Procedure outlining the procedures to be undertaken when verifying indicators was drafted and to provide guidance on when and how to collect, record and verify data relating to indicators. As an annex to the SoP, a document was drafted to consolidate the guidance provided by the MA on indicators and outline which verification sources are to be used for each indicator.
 - Meetings were held with all OPI beneficiaries including LMs, to provide guidance on the methodology to be used when collecting data relating to indicators and the verification sources to be maintained.

Key Processes Review on the implementation of the ERDF, CF and ESF OPs



- In 2019, an assessment of the key processes and practices involved in the funding process was undertaken in order to identify:
 - The main challenges that beneficiaries and stakeholders face in order to meet their obligations;
 - > The strengths and weaknesses within the process and their impact on the implementation of the programme;
 - > Any lessons learnt and recommendations for the next programming period.
- All beneficiaries were invited to attend meetings with the evaluators or (in the case of NGOs and Local Councils) complete an online survey. A total of 43 beneficiaries participated, of which 25 being supported under OPI. Meetings with horizontal stakeholders were also undertaken.
- As at end of year, this review was still ongoing as feedback from the Evaluation Helpdesk was provided in May 2020.

Key Processes Review on the implementation of the ERDF, CF and ESF OPs



- The responses of the beneficiaries can be grouped under 3 main headings, namely:
- the need for simplification,
- the challenge of insufficient capacity within the implementing organisations, and
- the need to shift from a one size fits all approach particularly with regard to the application process and verification procedures.
- Capacity issues were evident, which explains the demand for more simplification to streamline processes and procedures.
- The primary recommendation from beneficiaries and stakeholders is for the Managing Authority to provide increased hands on guidance throughout the application and project implementation process, whilst at the same time ensuring the process is simplified.

Evaluation of the impact of EU Funded for Malta | 2014 for Malta | 2020



- > Since Q4 2018, the MA has pushed for a common evaluation methodology to be applicable for all MS implementing the SMEi, in lieu of an evaluation carried out at EU level.
- > An agreement was reached with the Evaluation Helpdesk at DG REGIO to collaborate for the drafting of this methodology, which as at Q1 2020, was at draft stage.
- > On the basis of this draft methodology, the MA is in the process of drafting the ToRs, to evaluate the support given to SMEs through the SMEi, the grant schemes under OPI PA 3, both under TO3 'Enhancing the competitiveness of small and medium-sized enterprises', and indirectly through the Investing in Skills Scheme under OPII (TO10 'Investing in education, training and vocational training for skills and lifelong learning'). The MA is liaising with DG Regio's evaluation helpdesk to obtain further feedback and guidance.
- > The evaluation shall focus on assessing effectiveness, impact, and efficiency.








Training on VAT (above) and Common Errors (below)



Disbursement Targets





Concluding Remarks



- > Significant progress has been achieved in committing the Programme.
- In view of the successful progress in the implementation of the Programme, visible and actual progress of projects on the ground was recorded, resulting in further achievements of output and financial targets.
- Looking forward, 2020 presents its own challenges in terms of the N+3 decommittment target, and the implementation challenges related to the COVID pandemic in early 2020.
- All stakeholders need to strive to keep up the momentum achieved in the last years to ensure full absorption of EU funding.
