IDENTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

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2. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OPERATIONAL PROGRAMME (ARTICLE 50(2) AND 111(3)(A) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

2.1. Key information on the implementation of the operational programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data.

2017 was effectively the 3rd year of implementation of the programme, which saw the achievement of important milestones in terms of implementation of approved projects, the carrying out of first set of verifications and subsequently submitting the first payment claim, as well as progressed in the number projects approved, now covering all priority axes (PA). Total programme commitment as at end of 2017 is of $\in 106.3M$ (80.3%) (incl. TA), of which $\in 13.6M$ (10.3%) have been disbursed and by year end the MA had processed $\in 7.5M$ worth of payment claims to the commission with the rest expected to be processed in 2018. Physical and financial progress being reported on is of partially implemented operations as foreseen in Art. 5(3) of the Regulation (EU) no 1304/2013. An assessment of any significant problems encountered is elaborated further on, moreover a series of technical adjustments to the OP are presently ongoing and have also been presented to the Monitoring Committee which approved these changes on 16th May 2018, further details listed in section 6(a). It is to be noted that the data reported in this AIR already take into account the corrected indicator nomenclatures for R6 and R8. In addition with regards to the common results indicators, the MA is currently carrying out a telephone survey, as a result of which these figures will be reported by August 2018.

By December 2017, apart from the 6 projects approved by 2016 (€29.9M) and the *Access to Employment (A2E) Scheme* (€12M), there were 14 projects approved in August 2017 under Call II (€37.6M): 13 projects under PA 2 (IP9i and IP9iv); and 1 project under PA 3 (IP10i) and 4 projects approved in December 2017 (€10.8M) under Call III under PA 4 (IP11ii) with the other IPs open under same Call still under evaluation. In addition, throughout 2017 the *Investing in Skills Scheme (IIS)* — which is being implemented under PA 3, IP10iii - (€8M) was launched in March 2017. Preliminary agreements with the Beneficiaries of mainstream projects continued to be drafted in 2017 ensuring that the targets on implementation were properly outlined and agreed upon with the MA speeding up the kick-off on the ground. With reference to the N+3 targets and performance framework, the approved projects' commitments are covering in full the financial milestones for PA 1, 2, and 3. As regards to the output indicators milestones as part of the performance framework, in the case of PA 1, PA 2 and in part under PA 3 these are achieved, the remaining PA 3 indicator and PA 4 output and financial milestone are expected to be met with the approval of new projects.

By end 2017, over 8,000 persons benefitted from ESF (48% women; 40% below 25; and 9% over 54), through 7 projects and 2 schemes that were at implementation stage. These were being implemented under IP8i (employability) and IP8ii (youth unemployment and NEETS), IP9i (social inclusion), IP10i (ESL), IP10ii (tertiary tier education), and IP10iii (LLL). As regards to the Aid Schemes, the A2E by end of 2017, had 769 grants which were signed overall amounting to circa €5.1M, and for IIS by end of 2017, 202 grants were signed amounting to circa €0.4M. In both cases, SMEs were the main beneficiaries applying for such grants; and 754 persons are being supported through A2E and 1,230 persons benefitted from the IIS. As a result of projects and schemes implemented, a number of success stories have been noted by the beneficiaries, with testimonials reporting on how such schemes enabled them to improve their chances in obtaining needed skills, as well as in entering exposure experiences which upon completion resulted in the person either being retained or managing to find a job.

The MA continued its work to promote and implement further simplification on the ground, supported

also through participation of MA officials in a number of meetings of the Simplification Thematic Network at EU level. The MA also hosted the 7th meeting of this thematic network on the 5-6 December 2017. During 2017 the MA further worked on the finalisation of the Delegated Act (DA) application for the *Investing in Skills (IIS)* aid scheme under Article 14(1) of (EU) 1304/2013. Moreover, work on another DA application was carried out, for the approval of five standard scale of unit costs covering five different training activities implemented under the Youth Guarantee 2.0 implemented through IP8ii. The MA also worked on another study with the aim to simplify the implementation and reimbursement procedure of a number of schemes being co-financed under ESF 2014-2020 and implemented by the Public Employment Service – *Jobsplus*. These schemes include traineeships, work placements and work exposures, all of which implemented through the project *Training for Employment* implemented through IP8i. As part of the simplification work, the MA recognised the need for close partnership with key stakeholders involved in the programme implementation, including the Treasury, the Audit Authority and the Beneficiary's themselves. By end of 2017, it was estimated that 47% of the programme is committed to be using SCOs.

In 2017, the study in relation to the *ex ante* assessment on the applicability of ESF financial instruments to support students to further their studies was in the final stages. The study concluded that a market gap exists, since no market instruments are in place to address students who want to further their studies. To this end, an OP Change will be required in order to allocate €2.5M to the intervention field tied to financial instruments under Table 8 of OP for PA 3. In parallel the MA will then coordinate with the relevant stakeholders to finalise the investment strategy which would complete the ex-ante assessment.

2017 was the year of the Maltese Presidency of the Council of the European Union, and the ESF MA with the support of the European Commission organised an ESF Conference: Past, Present, Future on the occasion of 60 years of the ESF on 23-24 March in Gozo. Accompanying the conference was also an ESF exhibition which presented the evolution of the programme and highlighted a number of successful stories. The same exhibition was later open to the general public between 18-28 April 2017 in Hastings Garden, Valletta as part of the Annual Event of the programme, together with an info desk and online campaign.

In 2017, TA continued to support and facilitate the overall implementation of the Programme. Funds continued to be used in relation to implementation, training and capacity building, monitoring, evaluation, information and publicity and other expenditure necessary in support of the implementation of the Programme. By end 2017, €0.9M public eligible costs were incurred and processed through the system.

Whilst in the case of the aid scheme, the delegated act was in place by year end, the two mainstream projects, had the SCO groundwork at different stages, thus despite progress on the ground in terms of activities being fully in progress, the methods by which beneficiaries will be paid for milestones attained were still being established. Thus, no claims have yet been processed as yet, however it is estimated that circa €3.5M will be able to processed once the rates have been established.						
		All preliminary agreements were signed and work on the Grant agreements was at an advance stage.

By end of 2017, 569 participants benefitted or are benefitting from the training, out of which 194 were women of which 46% were in employment/further study six months after. By end 2017, 982 persons (of which 284 were women) received training through this programme in areas such as Work Ethics and Employability Skills, Applied Basic English or Maltese or Numeracy, and health and safety. By end 2017, 891 participants (90.7%) succeeded in gaining certification upon leaving training. The other approved projects were at preparatory stages including tendering and/or recruitment stages, as well as initial contract implementation stages tied to their respective actions. With regards to IP9iv, three out of the 4 projects are implemented by different stakeholders within the Ministry for health. The state of implementation had progress throughout 2017 in relation to tendering procedures, and first results will be recorded in 2018. 50.8% of this PA is expected to be implemented using SCOs. All preliminary agreements were signed and Grant Agreement were at an advanced stage.

PA 4	Building the Institutional Administrative Capacity	During 2017, most of the work under this Axis consisted in the project evaluation process, tied to Call III, lwhich closed on the 27th January 2017. As reported previously the MA made available all the funds under PA 4 (€11M). In December 2017 the first four projects were approved under IP 11ii. Once again, successful applicants were informed through an approval letter (with conditions as applicable) issued by the PSC. These projects are targeting socio-economic partners and civil society organisations, with the aim of strengthening their capacity in order to improve the delivering of ESF related policies. The signature of preliminary agreements is expected by Q1 of 2018. As at the end of 2017, the amount committed under PA 4 totals €0.4M representing 4% of the Priority Axis but it is expected to increase significantly following the conclusion of the selection of projects submitted under IP 11i by Q1 of 2018, some projects of which having commenced some of the planned activities by end 2017. Assessment on the use of SCOs under this PA will be undertaken once the outcome of the PSC for IP 11i is finalised.

4. SYNTHESIS OF THE EVALUATIONS

State of Play on the Implementation of the ESF Monitoring and Evaluation Strategy

An Evaluation Peer Review Meeting was held in Malta in collaboration with representatives from DG REGIO, DG EMPL, Key Experts, the Managing Authority (MA), as well as members from the Ismeri Europa team between 4th and 5th May 2017. The main aim was to promote a two-way learning approach through discussions on how to mitigate challenges, promote good evaluation practices, and discuss identified issues and potential way forward. The second day discussion focused on the possible areas were a CIE can take place taking into consideration: (i) restrictions in the national procurement regulations, (ii) (limited) availability of data on both the controlled and treated groups. Following the outcomes of such review and further internal assessment, the MA will engage in further discussion with the Commission in order to participate in Data Fitness Initiative for Counterfactual Impact Evaluation (CIE) being managed through the Centre for Research on Impact Evaluation in order to further assess the suitability of data and its contribution to CIE in certain areas such as youth employability and education.

During 2018, the Managing Authority (MA) will undertake a number of amendments to the European Social Fund Monitoring and Evaluation Strategy 2014-2020 which was presented to the Monitoring Committee for its approval on February 2016. The amendments will be undertaken in the planned timeline of evaluations to be undertaken during this programming period in order to reflect the pace of implementation of the Programmes which was slower than originally expected due to the late approval of the Programmes; the MA plans to present the revised Strategy to the respective Monitoring Committee during Q3 for its approval in accordance with Article 110(2)(c).

Furthermore during Q2 of 2018 the MA will continue with its discussion with the National Statistics Authority in order to analyse and fine tune the data reporting on the common long-term result indicators up till six months after leaving the ESF-funded intervention as indicated in Annex I of Regulation (EU) No. 1304/2013. The main objective is to analyse the educational attainment and any changes in the labour status and situation of ESF participants up to six months after leaving the ESF-funded intervention.

Ex Ante Assessment of Financial Instrument in Operational Programme II 2014-2020 financed through ESF

As already foreseen in the Operational Programme an ex ante assessment on Financial Instruments in line with Article 37 of Regulation (EU) 1303/2013 was initiated, which is now finalised. The assessment aims to understand whether, in the case of actions planned under PA 3, there is a financing gap, in terms of market instruments intended to support student to further their studies and which could be addressed through the use of Financial Instruments. If a gap exists, it is the programme objective to address this gap, through the use of ESF funds, in order to ensure that the programme continues to contribute towards improving the educational experience and its relevance to the labour market and increase investment in

human capital.

Hereunder is a summary of the above mentioned evaluation:

- 1. **Terms of Reference:** The Managing Authority (MA) assessed the potential use of Financial Instruments (FIs) under Priority Axis 3 of Operational Programme II 2014-2020. The objective of the contract was to identify the main causes and extent of the market failure in vocational and professional areas, to calculate the current financing gap between the existent scholarships/financial support at tertiary and equivalent level, as well as to highlight the increased demand of financial support to continue their studies in different areas, according to the market's needs. The report also sought to identify potential FI/s and provide the evidence of such adequacy against the identified market failure or suboptimal investment situation, and ensure that the FI could contribute to the achievement of the Programme and ESIF objectives.
- 2. **Methodology:** This study includes both qualitative data, which is used in the theoretical analysis, as well as quantitative data, which is integrated in a number of computations carried out to quantify the market gap. The qualitative data was collected through desktop research and consultation with major stakeholders (both demand and supply side providers, as well as policy makers) in Malta. The quantitative data was collected through a demand-side questionnaire and studies and statistics published by EUROSTAT, and the European Commission (EC), as well as the MEDE, the National Commission for Higher Education (NCFHE), and the National Statistics Office (NSO) as well as through specific requests to stakeholders, mostly in the educational and banking sectors.
- 3. **Market Failure:** This has been observed in the following ways:
 - o Information asymmetry: From the borrowers' side: (i) students might not be fully informed of the different financial products available through financial intermediaries as well as other schemes, grants and scholarships available; (ii) terms and conditions might be presented in a manner which discourages potential applicants. The online survey showed that a total of 43% of discouraged respondents (due to financial reasons) and 33% of those intending to study further, indicated being unaware of available funding as a reason for not seeking financial help;
 - The relatively short timeframes and complex requirements particular to each scheme, might discourage students from searching and analysing other financial options that might be available to them;
 - o Underdeveloped market: Risk and repayment maturity mismatch for loans as well as incomplete markets.
- 4. **Financing Gap:** This was calculated by removing the projected estimated supply of financial assistance for 2014 2020 from the estimated demand for finance. The study concluded that a market gap exists as the current (and projected) supply of financing assistance in Malta for education is failing to satisfy demand. Analysis of supply and demand in Malta for scholarships and assistance over the past decade presents a consistent shortfall between demand for assistance and available assistance with no or limited tools offered by existing financial instruments to support students with their endeavours. Certain subjects and levels have also not been covered by available assistance, grants. Some students also claim that the assistance granted does not adequately cover study related expenditure, especially for certain types of courses. It is also clear that lack of adequate funding is one of the reasons for failure to continue studying, although other factors such as work and family commitments, also have an impact. As regards to the next steps, it

involves consultation with the respective stakeholders in order to determine and identify the way forward to implement the investment strategy which on the basis of research conducted has led to the identification of a number of measures which the Investment Board will be tasked to assess.

Data Collection Common Immediate Result Indicators

As part of Malta's monitoring obligations, reporting of the common immediate result indicators has been submitted under Table 2A of the AIR for each respective IP, covering the years 2015, 2016 and 2017. Telephone surveys were used to collect the said indicators, which reflect participants' status up to four weeks after exiting an operation. The choice of using telephone surveys was made in view of the lack of national administrative registers which correlate with the data collection required for the immediate result indicators. An independent contractor specialised in the field of data collection was chosen to conduct the telephone surveys, using their in-house CATI software. The survey was designed to ensure short and focused questions, which ultimately were related to the data to be collected on indicators.

Despite the Managing Authority's efforts in seeking to collect individual participants' data to report on the immediate result indicators, an overall 36% non-response rate has been encountered across the operations being reported upon. Such non-response rate is due to a number of factors, ranging from reluctance of some participants to provide the information being requested to failure to reach participants nothwithstanding several attempts. It should be flagged that in the case of the latter, the contractor responsible for the telephone survey attempted to contact each participant up to three times, at different times during the day, including weekdays and Saturday.

The Managing Authority wishes to further clarify that reporting of the immediate result indicators relating to participants' qualification status upon leaving, in line with the guidance notes has been limited to those operations which have been formally accredited and for which participants have gained an accredited qualification. Thus the discrepancy with the data reported under the respective programme specific result indicators.

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6 ISSUES AFFECTING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE PROGRAMME AND MEASURES TAKEN (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

(a) Issues which affect the performance of the programme and the measures taken

In 2017, the implementation of the Programme gained momentum, with 18 new projects approved for funding and commencing their execution. This brings the total number of mainstream projects being implemented under the OPII to 24. With this increase, and the execution of such projects reaching various stages of progress, a number of new issues affecting the performance of the programme emerged. These issues were not materially different to those that emerged in the past programmes, and which also may have been reported in previous AIR including:

- 1. The selection stage of operations continued to be hindered by the submission of project applications that lacked the quality required for an efficient selection process. For example, in some cases, applicants failed to contact the respective Authorities with adequate information with regards to the implementation of Horizontal Measures (the Commission for the Rights of Persons with Disability (CRPD) and the National Commission for the Promotion of Equality (NCPE), amongst others), as suggested in the Application Form, leading to clarifications being requested by the Project Selection Committee during the assessment of projects received. This particular problem was mitigated through the imposition of conditions for those applications that were being positively considered, as well as the setting up of meetings between selected applicants and the relevant stakeholders, in an attempt to strengthen the actions to be implemented in line with the expectations of the competent bodies. In this regard, two sessions were held on 9th and 21st August 2017 covering six ESF projects. Others will continue to be held in 2018 for newly approved projects.
- 2. Another challenge to an optimal performance of the Programme relates to the delays in the execution of projects that are being experienced at all stages of implementation, as described below:
- (i) Procurement Stage: the time taken in the drafting and vetting of tenders has always been a major problem that is faced by all projects, at the early stages of the implementation. This is the result of the bottlenecks created at the Department of Contracts (DoC) when various implementing bodies commence their procurement process simultaneously and in parallel. This is further exacerbated but the delays in the drafting of tenders or reactions to the DoC's comments during the vetting process. As a mitigation measure, a decentralisation exercise was carried out in 2017 in order to decrease some of the workload from the DoC, through the creation of various Ministerial Procurement Units (MPUs) that were tasked with the role previously held by the DoC, with respect to tenders falling under the €250,000 threshold. While the idea behind this initiative is positive and will definitely go a long way in assuaging the bottlenecks faced at the different stages of procurement, in the immediate term, this solution led to the setting up of new structures that cannot handle the flow of work. It is expected that in 2018 the new decentralised system will be wholly operational, but in the interim, and in order to ensure that the tenders reaching such MPUs for vetting and publication is of good quality, the MA took the pro-active approach of launching and awarding a tender for the provision of training in public procurement, aimed at, amongst

other entities, organisations benefitting from EU funding. It is hoped that this training, which will take place in 2018, will help decrease the time lag between the preparation and publication of tenders through a better understanding of public procurement procedures to avoid additional problems further down the procurement phases.

- (ii) Implementation and Disbursement Stage: a general problem that seems to be faced by Beneficiary organisations when reaching the implementation stage of the project is that of recruiting professionals to manage the project, either because of limited expertise in very technical areas or because of uncompetitive conditions tied to the post. A similar situation is also being faced with availability of contractors who would be unable to work on parallel projects, because they do not have the required capacity. This situation results in delays in implementation that consequently lead to a delay in the payments, with the resulting slower submission of payment claims under the Programme. Even though the mitigating measures are limited since these issues are related purely to the economic development of the country, beneficiary organisations are still encouraged to seek alternative solutions to recruitment problems, through the issuing of service tenders that can provide them with a more competitive alternative to the private sector and allow market forces to work freely.
- (iii) Simplification: the MA has been working on a number of simplified cost options to be applied. However, considering the initial challenges including the need to undertake the necessary studies to establish the milestones, the rates and identifying the audit trail to maintain for the rates and the units, milestones to be used, there is always a steep learning curve which delay the process. Furthermore, this effects the disbursement and the submission of the related payment clams to the Commission. The MA recognised this challenge, and has involved from the outset key stakeholders involved in the discussions such as the Audit Authority, Treasury, the Supreme Audit Body in Malta so as to ensure that the practical dimension of implementation is carefully addressed ex-ante.

While the MA acknowledges that further progress is required in order to ensure the achievement of the Programme's targets, it is also confident that the mitigation measures put in place as a reaction to the concerns being faced, together with the cooperation always shown by the different stakeholders involved in the execution of the projects, can make a true difference in the efficiency and efficacy with which the Programme is being implemented.

Furthermore, the MA has also presented to the Monitoring Committee proposals for OP Change which will include:

- Amending of performance framework tables with regards to the financial amounts quoted, which will now reflect both the Union support and the National counterpart financial, rather than only the 80% of the EU share.
- Following the establishment of the outstanding baselines and target values of four result indicators, these are being inserted so to reflect what has been agreed upon with the Commission, in order to fulfil the general ex-ante conditionality.
- Technical adjustment under PA 4 IP11i, to the description of the category of region for two output indicators ID O17 and O6 to read 'in transition' rather than 'more developed'
- The revision of nomenclature of two result indicators R6 (IP8ii) and R8 (IP9i) in order to ensure consistency with the related output indicator re: CO06 and to ensure coherence with methodology

and projects used to establish baseline and target re: O6.




