

Managing Authority

Responsible for designing, developing and delivering the RDP

..including all communication activities, management of the NRN, LAGs, EIPs, M&E, TA ... as well as project selection and project management.

Paying Agency

Financial management of the RDP - processing of payments and various controls.

Responsible for the management of area based applications (Art28,29,31)

Monitoring Committee

Composed of Private/Public bodies & EC representation

Key role to develop selection criteria that ensure best quality proposals in line with RDP priorities
