State of Play of Measure Implementation



Highlights of Programme Implementation

- Contracting of new beneficiaries under various measures;
- **Tighter monitoring of projects** contracted in and prior to 2014;
- Budget transfers between Axis to ensure uptake of funds;
- **Supporting LAGs** in the launching of several calls for applications and contracting of beneficiaries under Axis 4;
- Targets for disbursement of the total amount committed for 2012 were executed and exceeded by end of quarter 4 of 2014.



Main Changes in 2014

Consolidation Process


- Process was completed on Monday 14 April 2014;
- The EAFRD Managing Authority migrated from the Office of the Permanent Secretary (MSDEC) to FPD (MEAIM);
- Responsibilities of the Competent Authority for EAGF and EAFRD, which resided within FPD (MEAIM), were transferred to the Policy Development and Programme Implementation Directorate within MEAIM;
- The Agricultural and Rural Payments Agency continued to reside within MSDEC;
- The Certifying Body continued to reside within the Internal Audit and Investigations Department (OPM).

6th Programme Modification

- Approved by the MC in August 2014, following written procedure;
- Submitted in September 2014, revised in December 2014;
- Approved by the EU Commission in January 2015;
- Minor text amendments;
- Budget shifts to satisfy demands for funding and minimise risk of unutilised funds.


Vocational Training and Information Actions




Measure 124

Cooperation for development of New Products, Processes and Technologies in the Agricultural and Food Sectors



- First call: September 2009
 - 3 applications received
 - 3 beneficiaries contracted
- Second call: October 2011
 - 5 applications received
 - 3 beneficiaries contracted
- Beneficiaries from the wine, milk, tomato and carob sectors
- Total: 6 beneficiaries

Infrastructure related to the Development and Adaptation of Agriculture




- First Call Water management:
 - One application received in 2011, beneficiary was later contracted
 - Grant agreement value: €4.6 million
- Second Call Increase accessibility to agricultural holdings:
 - 45 applications received by LAGs
 - €562,000 among 22 beneficiaries were contracted in 2014



- Third Call Increase accessibility to agricultural holdings:
 - One application received in 2014, beneficiary was later contracted
 - Transport Malta, the beneficiary, will resurface 55 rural roads
 - Grant agreement value: €5.9million






Positive impacts of M125

- Better water management by the agricultural sector
- Distribution of recycled water which can be used by farmers
- Facilitate access to agricultural holdings, reducing the risk of land abandonment
- Improving efficiency of the agricultural sector by enabling the use of machinery and means of transportation

- Total: 4 beneficiaries






Support for the Conservation of Genetic Resources in Agriculture








- Launch of Actions started in 2012 and continued throughout 2013 and 2014







Inter-territorial and Transnational Cooperation




GXF and MAGF

- GXF and MAGF are participating in the same cooperation project, 'MeDIETerranea', together with another 7 Italian LAGs

- LAGs participated festivals in Sardinia and Veneto
- The Maltese LAGs will organize a final festival in Malta in Spring/Summer 2015


GAGF

- Project entitled 'Network of Transnational Enogastronomic itineraries for the promotion of the Mediterranean cultural-food model'
- GAGF is developing a Wine and Food Route in Gozo
- This will be linked to a network of similar itineraries developed by partner LAGs
