





Designation of the Responsible Authority

- Following the opinion issued by the IAID, the RA was officially designated on the 7th of December 2015 and communication was submitted on the same day to the European Commission.
- By means of communication dated, 15th April 2016, the Commission requested information on the Management and Control System from the Responsible Authority, the Designating Authority and the Audit Authority. Feedback was submitted on 17th May 2016.
- Following this information, the European Commission informed the RA on the 16th of September 2016 that no major issues were found to be present on the management and control systems set up.



Modification of the NP

In April 2018, the Commission has communicated that additional funds will be made available to the Member States to address the most pressing needs and requirements of the sector of each Member State.

• €2,412,600 for the Entry Exit System

This triggered the process to update the NPs and on the 7th September, the amended programme was submitted to the Commission. This was subsequently adopted by the Commission on the 10th December 2018.





Proposed updates to the NP

ETIAS

ETIAS Regulation adopted late last year (entry into force in OCT 2018). ETIAS top-up, distributed to MS at equal shares, to cover very specific costs (Art. 85(1). As for EES top-up, the necessary Commission Delegated Regulation is required.

SIS


The relative Regulation was adopted late last year and MS will be distributed equal shares to cover the specific costs laid out in Art. 5. The revision of the NP will be carried out once the ETIAS delegated Regulation is adopted.

IT Systems

This allocation will probably be distributed according to the key and will aim at financing the development of IT tools.



Inauguration of the Passenger Information Unit

PRESS RELEASE BY THE MINISTRY FOR HOME AFFAIRS AND NATIONAL SECURITY AND BY THE PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARIAT FOR EUROPEAN FUNDS AND SOCIAL DIALOGUE

Minister for Home Affairs and National Security Michael Farrugia and Parliamentary Secretary for European Funds and Social Dialogue Aaron Farrugia presided over the inauguration of the Passenger Information Unit held at the Police Headquarters.

Minister Michael Farrugia said that the European Union felt the need to implement this directive after the European Union experienced an influx of irregular entrance through its borders in the last three years, and also the continuous threat to internal security. "European citizens expect that there is effective control through the EU entrance and exit systems, and through the Schengen areas. Thus, the European Union has developed an information system for further security, border management and migration. The implementation of the Passenger Name Record (PNR) is a system that is used in nember states in reaction to terrorism threats and criminality in the European Union".

Minister Michael Farrugia stated the Malta was one of the first member states that implemented this directive. The purpose of the directive is to process, detect, investigate and prosecute persons associated with terrorism and organised crime. The directive collects and transfers PNR data received from air carriers for flights intra-EU and from third countries. The procedure is based on two push methods—24 hours before the departure and after the closure of the flight.

Minister Michael Farrugia maintained that the passengers are evaluated according to a list of criteria determined beforehand and consequently are evaluated in various databases such as the SIS (Schengen Information System), NSL (National Stop List), and EIS (Europol Information System). Competent authorities which include the Police Force, the Outsons Department, and Europol, can request such data.


