
The outstanding ex-ante conditionalities

- Ex ante conditionality (G.7), is related to the establishment of the baselines and targets for all result indicators.
- There were four outstanding baseline and target values for the following four result indicators:
 - PA 2 IP 9i "Persons equipped with skills to empower them to move towards deinstitutionalization"
 - PA 2 IP9iv "Increase in awareness in relation to healthier lifestyle and health and safety at work"
 - PA3 IP10i "Improved pupils/student performance upon receiving support"
 - PA3 IP10iii "Second chance participants gaining a qualification/ certification upon Leaving"



PA 2 – IP9i

R10 - Persons equipped with skills to empower them to move towards de-institutionalisation











Methodology

- The **baseline value of 50%** was established through the compilation of historical data, using ESF 3.61 Embark for Life (E4L) as a benchmark.
- E4L provided training opportunities to institutionalised youth, young people in risk of homelessness and those living in inappropriate housing, by empowering them to develop their own independence.
- In the case of E4L, 240 vulnerable persons were trained / supported through this project, out of which 120 were employed or in further study six months after receiving assistance.

R12 - Increase in awareness in relation to healthier lifestyles and health and safety at work









Methodology



- This indicator deals with measuring increased awareness aimed to trigger a behavioural change.
- Historical data was used. A baseline of 19% was established using the increased awareness from the campaign: 'Eat Right, Stay Healthy'
- The increase in awareness was measured by seeing the difference in awareness pre and post intervention interviews.

PA 3 - IP10i

R14 - Improved pupils/ student performance upon receiving support









Methodology

- A baseline value of 34% was established by identifying those students who scored low in their Maltese, English and Mathematics benchmark examination in Year 6 in 2011. These students were then traced in 2016 when they were in Form 5 (Year 11), end of their secondary education, and their attainment in Maltese, English and Mathematics subjects was recorded.
- Out of 179 students, 61 students obtained at least an MQF Level 1 in one of the three core subjects.



Investment priority: 10i - Reducing and preventing early school leaving and promoting equal access to good quality early childhood, primary and secondary education including formal, non formal and informal learning pathways for reintegrating into education and training

PA 3 – IP10iii

R15 - Second chance participants gaining a qualification / certification upon leaving











Methodology (1)

- A baseline value of 73% was established based on an average percentage of participants successfully completing their training / education in four different compensation programmes:
 - MCAST foundation course followed by students who do not have the minimum requirements to enter MCAST Diploma courses;
 - Youth Inc. followed by young people who have completed compulsory education without having acquired the basic qualifications;
 - Revision and remedial classes offered to students who did not acquire the necessary qualifications to proceed to an academically oriented further education programme as part of the Youth Guarantee;
 - Alternative Learning Programme which were offered to students who were at risk of becoming early school leavers, and were in their last year of compulsory schooling (Year 11) and have an interest in vocational education.
