

# Designation of the Responsible Authority

- Following the opinion issued by the IAID, the RA was officially designated on the 7<sup>th</sup> of December 2015 and communication was submitted on the same day to the European Commission.
- By means of communication dated, 15<sup>th</sup> April 2016, the Commission requested information on the Management and Control System from the Responsible Authority, the Designating Authority and the Audit Authority. Feedback was submitted on 17<sup>th</sup> May 2016.
- Following this information Commission informed the RA on the 16<sup>th</sup> of September 2016 that no major issues were found to be present on the management and control systems set up.

PROGRAMMING OF FUROPEAN

- The List of Approved Projects is published on the website.
- Press Releases have been issued whenever a project has been approved.
- The first launch events of the projects started to be organised, the first one being of IOM on voluntary return on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2016.
- A three gate leaflet containing information on the Fund is being prepared for distribution to the general public by end of year.



- The Migration and Security Information System has been launched in June 2016.
- So far 48 users have been provided access to the system.
- 95 Payments have already been processed.
- Further updates to the system are envisaged to be completed by end of year.
