> Heritage List in 1980 as a commitment to preserve the site on behalf of the international community. Although an environmental control system was installed in the 1990s, technological advances and improved understanding of the challenges have necessitated the redesign of its environmental management to ensure the preservation and continued access to the site.

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The Project will contribute further to the preservation and promotion of the site in accordance with the UNESCO World Heritage Convertion (1972). It will also ensure that the site is preserved for the enjoyment of future generations in accordance with the Cultural Heritage Act and in part fulfiment of the policy responses laid out in the Dourism Policy for the Matees tabads (2012-2016).

The Project will contribute to the implementation of this policy by protecting and preserving this important heritage list. Its main objective is the preservation of the site with the view of keeping 1 accessible. The long-term conservation of the site shall be primarily addressed through the installation of a proper environmental control system which would sabilise the climatic conditions with the else. With this action being implemented, access to the site is ustained, allowing access to visitors for continued heritage appreciation.



Following the signature of the tender on Condition Assessment in October 2014, to date Heritage Malta finalised three payments covering 70% of the final amount of this contract. The final amount will be settled on approval of the final report. The contract will end on 4 February 2016.

Delays in tender adjudication / appeals that would have a direct impact on the overall timely execution	Ensure that adjudicating committee members are resourced and available at the appropriate time, and that they are well briefed on the procedures adopted in tender adjudication. Tender documentation is reviewed considerably prior to issuing tender to ensure that there are no areas that may give rise to misinterpretation.



common concerns....

Risk	Mitigation measure	
Tendering offers may be above the allocated budget resulting in cancellation of awards of tenders or lack of funding. This could delay implementation.	Crosscutting measures can be set and assistance sought from Government in the first year. It is to be ensured that sufficient financial provision is made in the government annual estimates during the project period.	
Lack of value in tender offers and/or the event of appeals that may delay project implementation.	Ensure that a good market research is carried out before allocating budgets. Proper and careful evaluation of tenders with well detailed explanations included in evaluation report and refusal letter to avoid appeals.	



Risks	Mitigation
Other risks identified within each project	Hold regular bilateral meetings with Project Promoters to detect possible risks and together discuss mitigation measures
	Carry out administrative and on-the-spot checks to detect irregularities prior to verification
