Fostering Sustainable Aquaculture activities, and processing and marketing of fisheries and aquaculture products, thus contributing to food security in the Union. Priority 2.1 and Priority 2.2 (excluding the Compensation to Operators)

Evaluation and Assessment

The Assessment and Selection of projects shall be undertaken by a Project Selection Committee. This call is envisaged to be a restricted call.

Applications will be assessed against the Eligibility and Selection Criteria by the Project Selection Committee and will proceed to be assessed against the Selection Criteria only if the application meets all the requirements of the Eligibility Criteria.

A project must achieve 50% of the marks to be considered for funding. However, the project must achieve the threshold for each of the relevant criteria in order to be considered further, even if the total points achieved exceed 50%.

The voting members shall decide how the project proposal addresses each of the below criteria and assign marking points according to the following guide:

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| • | Very good | 76 to 80% of points |
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• Unacceptable 1 to 25% of points.
