

Update on the status of the Enabling Conditions



Enabling Conditions

- ➤ All horizontal enabling conditions are fulfilled, and are applicable for both ERDF/CF/JTF and ESF+ Programmes.
- At the time of Programme approval, 10 thematic enabling conditions were deemed fulfilled.
- ➤ Since the adoption of the Programmes and since the last Monitoring Committee held on 24th November 2022, an additional 2 enabling conditions have been confirmed as fulfilled:
- T4.2 National strategic framework for gender equality (as part of the ESF+ Programme) and
- T4.6 Strategic policy framework for health and long-term care (as part of the ERDF/CF/JTF and ESF+ Programmes).
- > As at Q1 2023, 12 thematic enabling conditions were deemed fulfilled whilst 3 conditions remain unfulfilled.







- Article 49 CPR requires the MA to ensure online publication on single web portal (Fondi.eu) of a timetable of calls
- List updated at least three times a year
- Indicative data:
 - Geographical area covered by the call for proposal
 - > Policy objective or specific objective
 - > Type of eligible applicants
 - > Total amount of support for the call
 - State and end date of the call
- ➤ Currently foreseen in 2023:16 calls (ERDF, CF, JTF, ESF). Total of 35 calls across all funds with a total amount of support of EUR 511.7 million.










Overview of number of Calls and Total Support per fund for 2023



Update on Evaluations

Communicating Findings TO3 Evaluation – Assistance provided to SMEs

Status: Concluded

Deliverable: **Ex-ante** Assessment for a New Financial Instrument



Consider a more substantial involvement of national stakeholders in the design of financial instrument(s) backed by ESIF to reduce the risk of displacement effects, avoid the risk of fragmentation and ensure appropriate coordination



A guarantee scheme to support SME competitiveness could be renewed by activating the so-called 'Member State compartment' of InvestEU



To the extent that widening bank financing to SMEs is the primary policy goal, it is recommended that guarantee schemes with broad eligibility criteria are offered



The ESIF funds could be used to **establish pilot SME support schemes**, including new products such as blended instruments (e.g., combination of financial instruments and grants for technical support) and equity schemes

Communicating Findings TO3 Evaluation – Assistance provided to SMEs

Status: Concluded

Deliverable: Ex-ante Assessment for New State Aid Schemes



The strategy to provide **generic instruments covering the different lifecycle stages of firms**, regardless of the sector, proved effective and remains especially relevant in the aftermath of a crisis as they play an anticyclical role



More funds should be allocated to schemes **that support diversification and innovation** investments and consultancy services for modernisation and organisation/process re-engineering, also considering the twin green and digital transitions



Adapting and/or re-designing the SME internationalisation scheme, to avoid overlaps with nationally funded schemes



Considering widening the scope of services covered by the Consultancy Services scheme to include advisory services to prepare applications for investment support schemes among others



The **synergy between different streams of assistance**, such as financial instruments and grant schemes, should be improved to ease access to EU-funds, especially for micro-enterprises and start-ups



A **centralised information system**, possibly enhanced to further improve procedural efficiency, should be extended to all State Aid schemes
