Fostering sustainable fisheries and the restoration and conservation of aquatic biological resources *(Excluding actions addressing marine litter)*

Evaluation and Assessment

The Assessment and Selection of projects shall be undertaken by a Project Selection Committee. This call is envisaged to be a restricted call, issued to the Environment and Resources Authority (ERA).

Applications will be assessed against the Eligibility and Selection Criteria by the Project Selection Committee and will proceed to be assessed against the Selection Criteria only if the application meets all the requirements of the Eligibility Criteria.

A project must achieve 50% of the marks to be considered for funding. However, the project must achieve the threshold for each of the relevant criteria in order to be considered further, even if the total points achieved exceed 50%.

The voting members shall decide how the project proposal addresses each of the below criteria and assign marking points according to the following guide:

- Excellent 81 to 100% of points
- Very good 76 to 80% of points
- Satisfactory 50 to 75% of points
- Very poor 26 to 49% of points
- Unacceptable 1 to 25% of points.
