Greener Europe	02C0656	GEMS - Groundwater management in nitrate vulnerable zones with agriculture activities	GEMS	Energy and Water Agency	The European Environment Agency (EEA) estimates that Europe exceeds the nitrogen leakage limit by 3.3 times and phosphorus leakage limit by 2 times. Several EU countries report poor water quality in their territory and a systemic problem in managing nutrient pollution from agriculture and others have critical points where pollution is not adequately addressed. As a result, there is an urgent need to adopt additional measures to achieve the Nitrate Directive objectives and to improve public policies to support these efforts. Cooperative, Connected, and Automated Mobility (CCAM) offers a promising solution by making transport more efficient, accessible, and sustainable. However, many Transport Authorities (TAs) lack the knowledge and flexibility to integrate CCAM effectively. The NEXT RIDE project promotes interregional cooperation and knowledge-sharing to support TAs, especially in Eastern and Southern Europe, by building on the experience of more advanced regions.
